It is open to PhD students who are writing their dissertations in any area related to India Studies, but we also welcome MA and BA students who are working on their final project, based on these matters. Registration is free of charge, but to be eligible, the student must be a member of AEEII (www.aeeii.org) at the moment of application. The Doctoral Symposium will take place online, using the Zoom platform, according to provisional programming, on 22-2 March 2021. In the Doctoral Symposium, participants will have an opportunity to make a brief online presentation of their work in progress in any of the areas represented by AEEII. Their presentation should deal with the issues addressed or hypotheses tested in their theses research, the results so far obtained, and the methodology applied. Each presentation will last no longer than 15 minutes, followed by 10 minutes' discussion. Participants are expected to attend all presentations in their own area and be available for the discussions.

Along with the registration form, applicants must submit a title and an abstract of the project of no more than 300 words, indicating:

- main topic and issues, including • The the thesis proposed/hypothesis defended;
- The methodology (theoretical tools and standpoints);
- Where relevant, the corpus or primary bibliography under consideration;
- The results obtained so far.
- No more than five keywords.

Each area of the Symposium will be coordinated by the appropriate AEEII representative (area coordinators). They will make a selection from the applications received, chair the discussions and respond to the presentations.
